Stockport Grammar School.—Founded in 1487. Rebuilt by the Goldsmiths' Company in 1831, and vested in Trustees 20th January, 1860, pursuant to Scheme of Management of the Board of Charity Commissioners, dated 18th December, 1859, and amended schemes of 15th July, 1881, 3rd October, 1895, and 11th December, 1906, by which the management is now under the Mayor of Stockport (ex-officio), six Governors appointed by the Town Council of Stockport, two by the Cheshire County Council, one by the Lancashire County Council, and one by the Council of the Victoria University, Manchester, and also three co-optative Governors. Every representative Governor is appointed for a term of three years, except the representative Governor of the Victoria University, who is appointed for a term of five years.
