at the end.

STOCKPORT, 100,986, on the Fair Ground, Great
Portwood Street. *1st May, 1st Friday in June, 9th
July, 1st Friday in August, 1st Friday in September,
23rd October, and 1st Friday in December.*

Weekly Markets are held in the Castle Yard every
Friday, except when Friday is a Cattle Fair day.

ALTRINCHAM, 24,000. *Tuesday.*

BIRKENHEAD, 120,000. *Tuesday and Saturday.*

CHESTER, 46,000. Horses, monthly; cattle, weekly;
cheese, monthly. *Wednesday and Saturday.*

CREWE, 42,500. Cattle, *Monday.* Horses, monthly;
Friday and Saturday.

HYDE, 36,000. *Saturday.*

MACCLESFIELD, 35,000. *Tuesday and Saturday.*

NANTWICH, 12,000. *Saturday.*

OVER, 7,000 (estimated). First Wednesday after May
12, and first Wednesday after September 20.

SANDBACH, 6,600. *Thursday.*

STALYBRIDGE, 37,000. Last Monday in each month.

Markets.

The Manorial Tolls of the Borough were purchased by
the Corporation in 1847 from Lord Vernon.

Covered Market.—The covered market contains inside
103 permanent stalls, occupied as follows:—1 Book stall,
3 Confectionery, 4 Biscuits, 6 Earthenware, 2 Cutlery,
2 Tools, 2 Old Clothes, 2 Wool, 1 Smallware, 1 Hard-
ware, 3 Jewellery, 1 Curtain, 4 Oil Cloth, 2 Music, 2 Caps,
3 Old Shoes, 9 Drapery, 3 Millinery, 2 Incandescent, 4
Florists, 4 Greengrocers, 15 Butchers, 2 Provisions, 3 Dress
Goods, 6 Lace, 3 Fancy Goods, 1 Basket, 5 Ribbons, 4
Penny Bazaars, and 3 Threepence-Half-penny Bazaars.

Outside the covered market there are 2 Tripe, 2 Pudding,
3 Confectionery, 5 Cheese, &c., 2 Fish, 1 Oyster, 1 Old
Books, 1 Fowl, 16 Fruiterers, 7 Plants and Flowers, 12
Market Gardeners, 42 Dress and Drapery, and 12 Mis-
cellaneous stalls.

Market Hall.—In this hall there are 9 Cheese and Bacon
stalls, 1 Cage and Bird Seed stall, 1 Plant and Flower
stall, 1 Newspaper stall, and 1 Crampet stall.

Castle Yard.—The Castle Yard adjoining the market is
used on Fridays for Cattle and Pigs, and on Saturdays as
a fancy fair.

Offices.—New offices in the Castle Yard, with public
conveniences underneath, and fronting Vernon Street,
were erected in 1896-7, at a cost of £1,610 9s. 7d.
